

The Share Collection this weekend of 23/24 November is for the Sick & Indigent Room Keepers Society, which is the oldest charity in Dublin founded in 1790.

This collection occurs on an annual basis and is in line with the Diocese's appreciation of the work of the Society. The area between the canals represents

traditional boundaries within which the Society originally carried out its relief work, an area that now represents only 18% of the parishes within the City and County of Dublin. We are particularly grateful to parishioner for their generosity to the Society in past years.


